

## **Small Projects**

Satellite laboratory of the CVA/KVA WOAH Reference Laboratory for Rabies and Animal Welfare Research Centre established in Pondicherry, India

The CVA is pleased to announce that a satellite laboratory of our CVA/KVA WOAH Reference Laboratory for Rabies and an Animal Welfare Research Centre has been established at the Research Institute of Veterinary Education and Research (RIVER) Pondicherry, about 350 kms from Bangalore. This Rabies laboratory and Animal Welfare Centre will receive technical support from the CVA/KVA's established laboratory and centre at Bangalore.

#### **Book Programme**

Every year donated veterinary textbooks are sent free of charge from Australia. The CVA Book Program is coordinated by Dr Jim Connah in Hobart, Tasmania, Australia. Books are donated by veterinarians in Australia, all of whom are thanked for their generosity, without which the program would not exist. The books are available for distribution to veterinarians and veterinary students in CVA member countries in good standing. The current inventory in Australia comprises nearly 1000 books with over 700 different titles. During 2023 – 2024, over 100 veterinary textbooks were sent to countries such as Nigeria, Tanzania and Uganda Thank you to IDEXX for their continued support.

# Training Opportunities

#### **VET SUSTAIN**

As a part of our on-going collaboration, Vet Sustain and Vet Salus offered the CVA one free place on the on-line course entitled "A Veterinary approach to sustainable food and farming", The value of the offer was £1500. To gain the most benefit of the offer for its members, the Executive decided to supplement this by extending the award to three places on the course to eligible members, with the balance of funding being paid from the CVA Study Fund. The three successful recipients were Nicholas Muyale of Kenya, Chelsea Simo of Vanuatu, and Gabrielle Young of Jamaica.

### INTERNATIONAL WORKSHOP ON CANINE RABIES DIAGNOSIS (BANGALORE, INDIA)

The CVA, in collaboration with the Karnataka Veterinary, Animal and Fisheries Sciences University (KVAFSU) organised a training workshop on animal rabies diagnosis from 19 – 22 December 2023 at Bangalore, India. This training program was held at the Veterinary College, Bangalore where the KVAFSU-CVA, WOAH Reference Laboratory for Rabies is situated. A total of 6 participants were nominated by CVA under the CVA Study Fund Program and 4 were from India. The study fund participants were Dr Thushani Gunuwardana of Sri Lanka, Dr Timothy Mayiana Lesuuda of Kenya, Dr Patrick M Amponsah of Ghana, Dr Magdalena P Kasika of Tanzania, Dr Prudence Ndishimye of Rwanda, and Dr Natalino of Timor Leste.



## INTERNATIONAL WORKSHOP ON ANIMAL WELFARE RESEARCH HELD AT KVAFSU/CVA ANIMAL WELFARE RESEARCH CENTRE ( BANGALORE, INDIA)

The CVA and the Open Philanthropy Project sponsored an international workshop on animal welfare research from 17-18 January 2024 at the Veterinary College, Bangalore where the KVAFSU-CVA Animal Welfare Research Centre is situated. A total of 26 faculty and 20 postgraduate students attended, with the keynote address being given by Dr Cathy Dwyer, Director JMICAWE, The Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies, University of Edinburgh, UK.

### INDIAN VETERINARIANS PROVIDED TRAINING IN ANIMAL WELFARE (MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA)

Three staff of the KVAFSU-CVA Animal Welfare Research Centre, Dr. Vivek M. Patil, Dr. Mahadevappa D. Gouri and Dr. H.C. Indresh were sponsored by the CVA with financial assistance from the Open Philanthropy Project to gain technical expertise in animal welfare through a two-week training program designed by Prof. Andrew Fisher, Director, Animal Welfare Science Centre (AWSC), University of Melbourne, Australia from 29 October to 10 November 2023.



#### VETS FOR CLIMATE ACTION'S MESSAGE EXTENDED TO INDIAN VETERINARIANS

Dr Jeannet Kessels represented the Australian NGO 'Vets for Climate Action' at a symposium the Veterinary College, Bangalore, India, arranged by Dr S. Abdul Rahman, Executive Director, CVA and Dr S. Yathiraj, CVA Asian Regional Coordinator. The CVA hopes that this is the beginning of a fruitful partnership with Vets for Climate Action as we all play our part in addressing this critical issue.
